Parking

- ► The upstairs parking lot (Parking Lot 1) is designated for new comers, people with reduced mobility, the elderly and families with young children.
- ➤ The indoor parking lot downstairs (Parking Lot 2) will be closed at 1:00 pm on Sundays. If you exceed the time limit, you will have to wait until 10:00 am on Tuesday morning to collect your vehicle.

 Ash Street (Parking Lot 3) on Saturdays from 4:00
 -7:00pm and Sundays from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m.

- ► To be considerate of your neighbors, please do not park in the residential area.
- ▶ Please do not double park.
- ▶ When parking in the outdoor parking lot downstairs (Parking Lot 2), please be careful not to block the emergency exits and keep a distance of 3 feet from the building's exterior wall so that the emergency exit doors can be fully opened.
- ► Please park and lock your bike/e-bike outside. Do not park the bike inside the building.

Scripture Reading Plan

- ► This Advent season we will be reading Revelation together to learn about waiting and hope. Some Christians feel intimidated by Revelation because it is difficult to understand. While Revelation is indeed a book difficult to understand, we do not need to avoid it. When reading Revelation, try not to focus on understanding every single word or symbol. Instead, simply read it and feel the tension in the text. Our sermons during Advent will also help you engage with the book. Give it a try!

Testimony

1. Please share about your scripture reading this week? What do you find rewarding? What do you find frustration?

Know

- 2. Please review your sermon notes for this week. What did you learn that you did not know previously?
- 3. Read together again Revelation 1:9-19. What impression does this passage give you? What is the most intriguing saying in this passage to you? Why?
- 4. How does John describe Jesus in Revelation 1:13-16, and what do these symbols teach us about who Jesus is?
- 5. How does Revelation reveal the "real reality" beyond what we can see with our eyes?
- 6. How does the description of Jesus as both a victorious King and a slain Lamb shape your understanding of His mission?
- 7. How do we balance the tension between suffering and hope as we wait for Christ's second coming?
- 8. How does seeing Jesus as a king who suffers challenge worldly notions of power and leadership?

Feel

- 9. What does it mean for you personally that Jesus is "with us" even when we face darkness?
- 10. Have you ever experienced hope in the midst of chaos? How did that hope sustain you?
- 11. Why is it important to recognize that Jesus' death on the cross was not a defeat but a victory? How does knowing that Jesus has already won the ultimate victory affect the way you view your daily struggles?
- 12. What are the biggest temptations you face in the midst of suffering, and how can you overcome them?

Plan

13. What are the hindrances (including internal and external) for you to remain faithful to Jesus in the midst of suffering? What are the effective ways to remove these hindrances? Please ask your group members for advice.

Do

- 14. Resolve to remain faithful to Jesus in the midst of suffering. Share how practically you'll do this with your group members.
- 15. Invite a group member to be your accountability partner, and give him/her permission to rebuke you when you have not followed through on your resolution
- 16. Commit to God in prayer your resolution to remain faithful to Jesus in the midst of suffering. Ask the Holy Spirit to mould you more into the likeness of Jesus.
