- This week, we will delve into the section of Revelation where the evil empire of Babylon collapses. We might initially think that God is punishing those who do not believe in Him. However, the reality is that the world's corrupt systems create the chaos and madness that ultimately lead to its own destruction. Those who choose not to follow the way of the Lamb are, in fact, reaping the consequences of their own decisions. Instead of viewing this as God punishing unbelievers, it is more helpful to understand it as God saving us from the chaos and madness we have brought upon ourselves. Without God's intervention, humanity would ultimately destroy itself through its own choices.

#### **Testimony**

#### **Know**

- 2. Please review your sermon notes for this week. What did you learn that you did not know previously?
- 3. Read together again Revelation 14:1-15:4. What impression does this passage give you? What is the most intriguing saying in this passage to you? Why?
- 4. Revelation describes the faithful followers as having God's name written on their foreheads. How does this imagery impact your understanding of belonging to God?
- 5. Compare the character of those marked by God versus those marked by the beast. What lessons can we draw about true discipleship?
- 6. How does the description of Jesus as both a victorious King and a slain Lamb shape your understanding of His mission?
- 7. How do the contrasting harvests (grain and grapes) challenge our understanding of divine judgment?

#### Feel

- 8. Can you share a moment when you felt your faith was tested? How did you remain faithful to Christ during that time?
- 9. Have you ever experienced a situation where choosing to follow Christ made life more difficult? How did you handle it?
- 10. How does the image of Jesus with a sharp sickle make you feel? Does it bring comfort, fear, or something else?
- 11. What emotions arise when you consider that God's judgment includes justice for all wrongs?
- 12. How does knowing that Jesus endured the wrath of God for our sins affect your sense of gratitude and worship?
- 13. Revelation provides a vision of hope amidst chaos. How does this shape your response to the challenges of today's world?
- 14. In light of Revelation, what does it mean for you to prepare for the "ripe harvest" in your own life and community?

#### Plan

15. What are the hindrances (including internal and external) for you to remain faithful during trials and persecution? What are the effective ways to remove these hindrances? Please ask your group members for advice.

#### Do

- 16. Resolve to remain faithful during trials and persecution. Share how practically you'll do this with your group members.
- 17. Invite a group member to be your accountability partner, and give him/her permission to rebuke you when you have not followed through on your resolution.
- 18. Commit to God in prayer your resolution to remain faithful during trials and persecution. Ask the Holy Spirit to mould you more into the likeness of Jesus.
