Parking

- ▶ Please do not double park.
- ▶ When parking in the outdoor parking lot downstairs (Parking Lot 2), please be careful not to block the emergency exits and keep a distance of 3 feet from the building's exterior wall so that the emergency exit doors can be fully opened.
- ▶ Please park and lock your bike/e-bike outside. Do not park the bike inside the building.

Testimony

- 1. Can you share how God has worked in your life in the past week?
- 2. Can you share a personal experience of betrayal or hurt? How did you sense God's comfort and protection during that time?

Know

- Review your sermon notes from this week. (If some group members have yet to hear the sermon, consider listening to the recording together and taking notes)
- 4. What new insights or concepts did you learn from this week's sermon that you hadn't known before?
- 5. Why does anointing oil carry such significant meaning in Jewish culture? Besides representing offering or sacrifice, what other spiritual symbolism does it hold?
- 6. According to other Gospels, what additional details are given about Judas's betrayal of Jesus? What are your thoughts on Judas's motives?

Feel

- 7. How do you feel about the actions of the unnamed woman? What moved or impacted you most?
- 8. When you hear that someone betrayed Jesus for calculated reasons, have you ever reflected on moments in your faith journey where you might have made similar calculations?
- 9. Have you ever felt that God's goodness and beauty were being distorted by human sinfulness but later saw God redeeming that experience?

Plan

- 10. In what ways do you need to live out all that God has entrusted to you more faithfully?
- 11. What is your "alabaster jar" that you are reluctant to break? What concrete action can you take if you are willing to offer it?
- 12. What practical ways can you discern God's timing instead of relying on your own calculations?

Do

- 13. What is something you can start doing today to reflect your wholehearted love for the Lord?
- 14. How can you begin to show love toward people who tend to be calculating or self-centered?
- 15. Invite one group member to keep you accountable and allow them to lovingly rebuke you if you fail to follow through on your commitments.
