Parking

- ➤ The indoor parking lot downstairs (Parking Lot 2) will be closed at 1:00 pm on Sundays. If you exceed the time limit, you will have to wait until 10:00 am on Tuesday morning to collect your vehicle.

- ▶ Please do not double park.
- ▶ When parking in the outdoor parking lot downstairs (Parking Lot 2), please be careful not to block the emergency exits and keep a distance of 3 feet from the building's exterior wall so that the emergency exit doors can be fully opened.
- ► Please park and lock your bike/e-bike outside. Do not park the bike inside the building.

- 4. How does Revelation 22:1-7 compare with the initial descriptions of Eden in Genesis? What do you think this implies about God's original and final intentions for humanity?
- 5. Why is the New Jerusalem described as a cube, and what does this tell us about our future relationship with God?
- 6. Why do you think Revelation uses the name "New Jerusalem" despite the city's historical associations with sinfulness and rebellion?
- 7. What does it mean for you that New Jerusalem symbolizes both redemption and a perfect community?

- 8. How do you feel knowing that God will make His dwelling place with us, as stated in Revelation 21:3? Does it bring you comfort or raise questions?
- 9. What emotions arise when you imagine living in a world without evil, sin, or darkness as described in Revelation?
- 10. When you hear that God will "make everything new" (Rev 21:5), what hope or concerns come to mind for you personally?
- 11. How does the idea that we will become the New Jerusalem, a restored community, make you feel about your current relationships within the church?
- 12. What does the removal of all curses in Revelation 22:3 mean for your personal journey of faith?

13. What are the hindrances (including internal and external) for you to help create a church community that embodies the characteristics of the "New Jerusalem"? What are the effective ways to remove these hindrances? Please ask your group members for advice.

- 14. Resolve to help create a church community that embodies the characteristics of the "New Jerusalem". Share how practically you'll do this with your group members.
- 15. Invite a group member to be your accountability partner, and give him/her permission to rebuke you when you have not followed through on your resolution.
- 16. Commit to help create a church community that embodies the characteristics of the "New Jerusalem". Ask the Holy Spirit to mould you more into the likeness of Jesus.
