Parking

- 4. Why do you think Jesus deliberately chose to be born during such a dark and oppressive time?
- 5. What does Jesus' birth in Bethlehem, as a migrant and homeless person, reveal about his character and mission?
- 6. How does the idea of Jesus' incarnation reflect the values of the Kingdom of Heaven compared to the values of this world?
- 7. What parallels do you see between Jesus' birth and the "opposite order" of the Beatitudes in the Sermon on the Mount?

Feel

- 8. How does Jesus' willingness to embrace suffering and humility make you feel about your own challenges?
- 9. What emotions arise when you consider Jesus' choice to be born into a world of oppression and darkness?
- 10. When you think about the spiritual reality revealed to the shepherds on the night of Jesus' birth, what feelings does it evoke?
- 11. What fears or hesitations do you have about living a life modeled after Jesus, especially in embracing humility or facing injustice?
- 12. How do the angels' proclamation of peace and glory challenge the reality of the brokenness we see in the world today?

Plan

13. What are the hindrances (including internal and external) for you to fully embrace a life of humility and self-sacrifice? What are the effective ways to remove these hindrances? Please ask your group members for advice.

Do

- 14. Resolve to fully embrace a life of humility and self-sacrifice. Share how practically you'll do this with your group members.
- 15. Invite a group member to be your accountability partner, and give him/her permission to rebuke you when you have not followed through on your resolution.
- 16. Commit to fully embrace a life of humility and selfsacrifice. Ask the Holy Spirit to mould you more into the likeness of Jesus.
